Begin your day with a tour of the Delaware Art Museum. Explore the Museum's collection of 19th century British Pre-Raphaelite art—the largest in the country—as well as an extensive collection of American art and illustration. Afterwards, enjoy a delicious lunch in the Museum's contemporary East Court. Travel to Hagley Museum and Library, where the du Pont story begins. In 1802, a young French immigrant, E. I. du Pont, found the Brandywine River to be the perfect spot to build his black powder mills and establish the DuPont Company.
